

Murray & Roberts Jack Cheetham Memorial Award

1. CONDITIONS OF PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

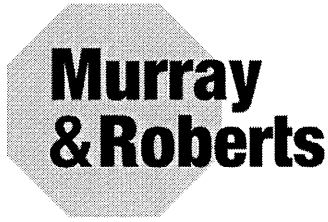
The winners of the 2009 Jack Cheetham Memorial Award will receive prize money to the value of R500 000, payable in amounts of R150 000 in 2009, R100 000 per annum in 2010, 2011 and 2012 and R50 000 in 2013. These payments will be made via the federations or sports associations to which the winners are affiliated and are conditional upon:

- 1.1 Submission of an annual Implementation Plan over the five year period for approval by the Jack Cheetham Selection Panel by no later than 10 November 2009 and by no later than 31 August in each year of payment after 2009.
- 1.2 Signed agreement of compliance with the Obligations of the Winner (as stated in 2) by no later than 10 November 2009.

2. OBLIGATIONS OF THE WINNER

The winner must adhere to the following:

1. Allocate a minimum of 30% of the prize money to professional coaching for the project's development players and coaches;
2. Limit spending on administrative items to 30% of the prize money;
3. Submit written activity reports and audited financial statements in June and November of each year of payment. More regular reports are encouraged but are not obligatory;
4. Submit to a process of audit and review, as required by Murray & Roberts;
5. Obtain the Selection Panel's written approval for any changes in the Implementation Plan prior to implementation;
6. Participate in promotional activities related to the Award, such as media interviews and photo opportunities;
7. Gain the approval of Murray & Roberts for the use of the brand of Murray & Roberts and / or those of the Partners (SASCOC and Sowetan).



Nominations for the 2009 Murray & Roberts Jack Cheetham Award

Murray & Roberts, in partnership with the South African Sport Confederation and Olympic Committee (SASCOC) and Sowetan, is pleased to invite nominations for the 2009 Murray & Roberts Jack Cheetham Award.

The Award:

- recognises the character and ideals of Jack Cheetham, a former director of Murray & Roberts and captain of the South African cricket team in the 1950's
- contributes to the development of sport and supports the unifying effect that sport has in South African society

To be eligible for nomination, a sporting code, club, team or individual must demonstrate a meaningful contribution to the development of sport in South Africa and it must benefit previously disadvantaged individuals or people with disabilities.

The scope of the award has been broadened to include sport for people with disabilities. As a consequence, two winning projects will each be awarded prize money of R500 000 over five years. (Conditions apply.)

Nominations must include:

- a short description of the project, with detail on how it has contributed to development and community upliftment
- the role of sport in the project
- the inspirational role of leadership in the project, including a specific example or examples of leadership
- future plans and goals and an explanation of how these will contribute to the sustainability of the project

New projects that have not yet been implemented will not be considered.
